4. Executive Reports

4.1 President's Report – Sarah Kohut

Hello, everyone. I hope you had a relaxing March Break. And I hope that you caught up on schoolwork. Because I'm sure that we all had tons of it. I know I did. So, since we didn't meet last week, I will go briefly over the stuff that I did in the last week of February, and then also the stuff I did over March Break. So, my goodness, on Tuesday, February 23, was my Instagram takeover day. So, I'm not going to go too into detail on what I did on that day, because hopefully you all were tuning in, watching me vlog my whole day. It wasn't that crazy. It wasn't very exciting, but I hope everyone enjoyed our Instagram takeovers, nonetheless. And then on Wednesday, I had a NBSA exec meeting like they usually do. We were still prepping for our Annual General Meeting what's happened over the past two days. And then on that Thursday, February 25. I had a Senate Committee on reconciliation meeting where we welcomed Jonah to the committee. That was his first official meeting. So that was super exciting. And then I watched the speaker event that the Indigenous Students Reconciliation Committee put on and that was really fantastic goes very well done. So big shout out to them. And then on Monday, the 22nd, I met with Tyler, who is running in the election for President, as I'm sure we all know. And then I had my biweekly check in meeting with Ryan Sullivan. We haven't met in a while because things kept coming up, but it was nice to touch base with them. And then on that Sunday, I attended the candidates meeting alongside all the candidates. I also submitted some responses for The Brunswickan, and they reached out to me to do a piece on myself and Sean, who is the president of UNBSU. Just as our terms are coming to an end, just kind of like a final wrap up piece, they did a piece on us at the start of our term, which was really well done. And so, I'm



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looking forward to seeing this one. And then over March Break, the grind never stops. STUSU never stops. So, on Tuesday, Matt, and I met with Reg who's the accountant for the university to talk about the bus pass, because of the fact that we amended the bus pass this year, as a result of COVID, we voided our previous contract. So now we are entering negotiations for future bus pass contracts. Following whenever, after the election is coming up, so that kind of caught Matt and I by surprise, but we're happy to enter negotiations with Frederick Transit to figure out the bus pass for future years. And then on Wednesday, I met with the NBSA Financial Aid Committee to go over end of year report that we presented at the AGM. And then the NBSA Executive also met to still talk about AGM. And then on Thursday, I attended the VP Administration and VP Student Life candidate debate. That was very well done. And I thought it went pretty smoothly for first time doing a completely virtual debate. Unfortunately, I had to reschedule the Health and Wellness Committee meeting for that day because it overlapped with the debate. So, we had that meeting on Friday morning, to go over our year end report of for the AGM, which also happened in that same day. Friday was the first day of the AGM. The purpose of the AGM is it's the NBSA last conference of the year. Also, AGM stands for Annual General Meeting. So, it's pretty much exactly what it entails. We, it's kind of just a conference to wrap up the year, tie up any loose ends of things we're working on, reflect on the year prior, give some feedback. The board did a review of myself and Patrick as vice chair and chair. And then the board also did a review of Waseema, our executive director. And so that was great. And then Friday evening, I attended and facilitated the President's candidates' debate, which is also really well done. I put Tyler and Seydona through the wringer just feeding them audience questions for about an hour straight, but it was great. They took it like champs. And the engagement with the audience for that debate was absolutely fantastic. It was so great to see students, you know, really engaged with what STUSU does and care about our election. I also created the graphic for the debates and put that out on social media and I also figured out how to host a zoom webinar and it was a trial-and-error process. But I think I got it down pat now at this point. And I think that is all for me.

Tyler: Just a question about the bus passes. I don't know if it's possible or not, since they did convert to a whole ready pass system, but would it be possible for us to like talk about maybe going back to the way it used to be with just scanning our ID cards? Again, not a clue if that is possible or not, but I think it would be a lot more accessible for our students, if you could find a way to go about doing that.

Sarah: I can't necessarily make a comment on whether or not that's 100% feasible, but I can take that into consideration. We will be meeting with Frederick transit in the very near future to kind of discuss our options, and figure out, you know, what kind of different ways the bus pass can look like that's, you know, feasible for our students in the sense of minimal increases to the cost. Optimal accessibility, stuff like that. So, I definitely can take that into consideration. And, and as I said, there's absolutely no promises that I can make it happen, but I can definitely bring it up to them and see if it's a possibility.

4.3 Vice President of Education's Report – Megan Cormier



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Hello, everyone. So, this might be a little bit of a longer report just because like Sarah said, it is going to be that week of February and then the March Break. So, starting off with what I've done with the STUSU. February 22, I met with the Academic and University Affairs Committee. The 23rd, I had a Retail Review Committee meeting in the morning, kind of directly following that I had a Remote Learning Committee meeting. And then directly following that I had an experiential learning committee meeting. So, it was quite a jam-packed day. And then on the 25th, I did my Instagram takeover on our social media. And it was also quite a busy day started off with my office hour. Then I had a very brief Sustainability and Environmental Awareness Committee meeting. Following that I had my remote learning conversations with Dr. Robear. And then to finish off the evening, we had our weekly executive meeting on the Thursday. During the day, I also attended the indigenous education awareness series, part one on treaties, which was very informative, and I think it gave some great context, as someone who's doing a native studies minor, it actually added to what I'm learning, and I think that was really impressive. I've been speaking to a nurse about an upcoming event. And then this week, I also created a new graphic for MLA Mondays, which will be occurring tomorrow. And the topic of that discussion is surrounding University funding. So, kind of what we want to seek in a memorandum of understanding. David Kuhn wants to hear what your thoughts are on where university should be spending money or where the province should be putting money for universities. So, moving now to the NBSA. On the 23rd. I met with the NBSA Financial Aid committee to work on our transition document. The second of March, I met with the committee again to finalize that work before the AGM. For the past two weeks, so just whenever, over Slack, the NBSA Systemic Racism committee and the NBSA Sustainability committee have been finalizing our plans as well for the year and have created a transition document that was presented at the AGM. So, one thing all of our committees did was create those documents. And we'll continue to update them as we are not done with our term yet but wanting to ensure there was something there for groundwork for the delegates who will be coming very soon. And then like Sarah said, March 5, and 6, we had our NBSA AGM. So, turning now, finally to my work with CASA. February 22, I had a liaison call. On the second, the board had our biweekly board meeting. The third, I had another liaison call, the board has also started doing drop-in calls for members. So, the first one occurred on March 3 at 1pm. But I wasn't able to go, but I will be posting when those are. So, people want to drop in to talk to the board, because I think it's open to all members. And it would be a great experience for students to kind of talk about CASA because I know sometimes there can be some disconnect because it is federal but luckily, I'll probably be there so might ease you into a conversation of federally about politics. And finally, last week, the board sent in pictures of ourselves to the CASA communications person, which is (?) as she is creating a graphic for International Women's Day. And that I think is all for me.

4.4 Vice President of Student Life's Report – Kyle McNally

7.1 Close the Gaps Campaign

Megan: I just wanted to kind of talk about a campaign that CASA has been doing recently, just to bring it all to your awareness and ensure that we're having as many students participate in the campaign as possible. So, for the past month, CASA has been running a national campaign called Close the Gaps. And it's a grassroots campaign by students for students seeking to highlight the many challenges faced during this unprecedented year. Sorry for using that word. I know it's a lot. But whether these are due to COVID or they've just been kind of exacerbated by COVID. We want to help tell students stories when it comes to these issues and bring it to the attention of the people who can make the difference, which is the federal government. So, we're asking that students interact with our materials, whether it be on social media or on the website, which is closethegaps.ca, to share whether they have faced issues relating to access to technology, childcare for students, discrimination, and post secondary education, jobs for students, mental health funding, student financial aid and support for international students. And it is important that our students interact with the campaign, as our stories can be sent directly to the government. By going to the take-action tab on the website, you can fill out what you want to be sent, and there's an email that will be sent on your behalf to MPs and members of government just to share what your gap is. And you can also go on the website and make a little autogenerated social media share. I don't know what it's actually called, but where you kind of discuss what your gap is. And it's important to not only just get this spread among students to raise awareness for the campaign, but the more the students interact with this, the more stories we have to give to the government. And the greater the push is, that they'll actually address them because we want them to know that, obviously, we're struggling. But sometimes, statistics like we have gathered in the past through abacus data aren't enough, we kind of need to share that personal side. So, they know that we're actually struggling, and they actually have to do something about it. They can't just sit by while students don't have access to technology, or student's mental health is suffering, because there's no resources areas provided by our post secondary institutions. So, I just wanted to jump in quickly and bring that up. And you can find all of these on the CASA Instagram page, or like I said, the close the gaps website, which is closethegaps.ca.
